

- Trees must not obstruct boundary pathways or cast shadows on neighbouring plots.
- Trees must not be allowed to grow to more than two metres in height.
- Trees must be pruned to keep them to a maximum of two metres in height.
- All trees must be correctly maintained, pruned, and kept in good order.
- Trees should not constitute more than 20% of the plot.
- Ensure that your trees or bushes do not adversely affect neighbouring plots or paths.

Types

Fruit trees must be on dwarf rootstock. It should be possible to harvest fruit and to prune the tree without climbing the tree or any other structure. Suitable rootstocks are:

- M27 for apples, extremely dwarfing
- M9 for apples, dwarfing
- M26 for apples, dwarfing
- Pixie for plum trees, dwarfing
- Gisela 5 or G5 for cherries, semi-dwarfing
- Quince A or for pears, semi-dwarfing
- Quince C for pears, dwarfing

Trees other than fruit trees are not permitted on an allotment.
